

Teversal St. Katherine's Parish Magazines 1905-60

Teversal Heritage Group has been fortunate to receive a donation of a considerable number of Teversal St. Katherine's Parish Magazines for the years from 1905-1960. Some years are complete but more often months are missing, and in some cases only one month is represented.

The records are made available as a research tool, particularly for those wishing to research their family history who may find their ancestors mentioned in the births, burials and marriages at St. Katherine's, in the school records mentioned and in the social and other activities. In some cases it is possible to trace the history and use of buildings. Some magazines contain extracts from earlier parish documents that are of historical significance. Earlier copies show how the Village interacted with the noble family that was the landowner and, in particular, with the Dowager Lady Carnarvon who spent time at Teversal Manor. Those who are interested in what life was like in Teversal in the years covered will find a wealth of information.

As the Magazines cover the years of the First and Second World Wars, they give a glimpse of day to day life and how the community fared during the conflicts, as well as giving details of some of the young men of Teversal who served and what happened to them.

A little patience when delving into the records will often yield satisfying and sometimes surprising results.
