

Dear Friends.

The season of Lent commences very early this year, and Ash Wednesday falls on Feb. 7th—it can fall on Feb. 4th but this is very rare indeed. In consequence Easter Day will also fall early—this year it comes on March 25th—known to churchpeople as Lady Day or the Festival of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and to many others as Quarter Day. When a collision of important events like this occurs the commemoration of the lesser is postponed for several days and hence Lady Day will be observed this year on Tuesday April 3rd.

The coming of Lent reminds us once again of the duty of a spiritual overhaul. We set about spring-cleaning our houses and forget altogether about our souls. Yet the Christian Church year by year calls her members to look within and appoints this season specially for that purpose. Our Blessed Lord Himself in one of His immortal parables tells us how a woman who has lost a piece of money will take a lighted candle and sweep her house diligently until she finds it. Since last Lent you and I may have lost a bit of our Christian character—our churchgoing may have become less frequent, our communions less regular, our prayers neglected, our hearts harder. If so, as Christian people, we ought to be doing something about it. The above parable suggests a way and Lent affords an opportunity.
