

IN MEMORIAM

Once again I have to record with sorrow the passing of another old parishioner, Miss Elizabeth Clarke. Miss Clarke was born at Kimberley in the year 1870 and came to Teversal when she was three years old. She taught first at Stanton Hill and then, at the early age of 19, was approached by the Reverend Barrett to take over the school at Teversal, which she did. She held this post for nearly 42 years and during her headship the present school building was erected. In the parish magazine for March 1906 are these words—"The children assembled in their old school for the last time for day school lessons on February 12th"—almost fifty years ago. Later the same day the new school was opened by Lady Carnarvon, who

spoke some very wise words to the parents of the scholars.

Throughout her long years at Teversal Miss Clarke had associated herself closely with the life of the parish and at one time was a prominent member of the choir of the Parish Church and a superintendent of the Sunday School. Advancing years, however, compelled her to relinquish many of these activities, but she remained a faithful churchgoer and communicant as long as it was possible for her to do so. Many parishioners will remember her as a very gracious lady to whom they owe a debt of gratitude for her ministry to them in their younger days. She passed to her rest on November 4th and her mortal remains were committed to the ground on November 8th, close to the church she loved and served so well.

To her niece, Miss Hartshorne, who cared for her so devotedly, and to her other relatives, we express our deep sympathy—their loss was in many ways ours as well.
