May 29<sup>th</sup> End of School Year. Average for the year 34.99. The attendance this week has been very poor owing to the very wet weather.

June 5<sup>th</sup> This has been a very wet week. This has made the attendance very poor as those living at a distance could not attend. Mr Richardson has examined the registers this week and found them correct (June 2<sup>nd</sup>)
