Over 30 Christmas gifts were sent to the Editor by the children of Teversal School for distribution among the poor children attending the City Schools.


## CHURCH OF ENGLAND HOMES FOR WAIFS AND STRAYS.


The Collections made on Sunday, July 18th (£1 16s. 6d.), were given to the Curates' Augmentation Fund.






