THE MOLYNEUX CHARITY.

Mrs. Diana Molyneux, who died at Bath in 1753, by her will left to the poor of Teversal the sum of £20, which, with annual interest, is secured by a bond given by Sir Charles Molyneux, Bart., to the said parish.

The sum of £1, interest of this benefaction, is paid annually by Lady Carnarvon to the Churchwardens of Teversal.

Sir Charles Molyneux, who died July 30th, 1764, left also by his will to the poor of the parish of Teversal the sum of £50, which is now in the hands of the Charity Commissioners' who pay annually the sum of £1 8s., by four quarterly payments, into the Union of London & Smiths' Bank, Mansfield, to the order of the Churchwardens of Teversal.

There is, therefore, the annual sum of £2 8s. interest from this Charity to be distributed at the discretion of the Churchwardens of Teversal.
